Dear Cavalcaders:

The 64th Annual International Roundup Clubs' Cavalcade is just around the corner. The dates are **Monday, July 12 through Sunday, July 18, 2010.**

We are excited to announce the bands for this year. Wednesday night Jack Rowdy Band, Thursday night Randy Rogers Band, Friday night Jason Boland & The Stragglers, & Saturday night will feature Wade Hays. Advance dance tickets may be purchased at www.ticketweb.com.

Dance admission at the gate: Wed night - \$7.00; Thurs - Sat nights - \$15.00 each. Rodeo Admission per Performance: \$5.00/adults Morning Performance, \$7.00/adults Night Performance & \$3.00/children 6-12. Rodeo Arm Bands (all Rodeo Perfs): \$15.00/children.

We are offering an advanced All-Access and Adult Rodeo Only arm bands. The All-Access arm bands will get you into all rodeo performances, and dances for \$65.00 (Adults only). The Adult Rodeo Only Arm Bands will get you into all rodeo performances for \$30.00. Armbands have to be purchased between April 15th & June 6th to receive the discount. You can purchase them by credit card through our website at Ticketweb, or on the entry blank. You only need the total number of arm bands you want, include the money with your Entries. The arm bands will be in the club packets, with your back numbers at the office. **After June 6th the All Access Armbands will be \$75.00 & Adult Armbands will be \$40.00.**

You may also pre-pay for your Electric by completing the space on the Entry Blank. Again, I just need the total number of Electric Stickers for your Club. Include \$75.00 for each sticker with your Entries & the stickers will be in your packet. This will pay for your electric for the entire Cavalcade. Every camper/trailer with an air conditioner is required to have an Electric Sticker.

Pre-purchasing Arm Bands & Electric Stickers is strictly optional and is only offered to help cut down on the expense you incur when you get to the Cavalcade.

Enclosed are your Rules, Entry Blank and Queen information. Please review all of the Policies and Rules for any changes. ***The Entries, Queen picture, and Queen information sheets must be post marked by June 6th.*** A \$50.00 fee will be applied to all entry blanks that are not received by the deadline. Each Club is required to have at least 1 Porta-John, regardless of camping status. All charges are listed on page 3 of the Entry Blank. Stalls can be rented through the County shop, by calling 287-1570. Complete the Entry Blank and **send in all fees by June 6th.** If you have a preference of days, write a 1st & 2nd choice next to the event.

If you are a new club or do not know where your clubs' boundaries are, Scott Williams will set your campsite on Saturday, July 10th between 12pm & 6pm. You must make arrangements to be there on this day or you will need to wait until the office opens on Sunday, July 11th from 1pm-5pm.

Club members should carry a Club ID (membership card, etc.) or an Arm Band to assist the deputies in keeping Non-Cavalcaders out of the camp area and cut down on the late-night traffic. Also, all horses entering the grounds must have a current **original yellow coggins** and must have their horses marked to compete.

Congratulations on becoming a Cavalcade Queen Contestant!

On the reverse side is your Preliminary Horsemanship Pattern and attached is your Information Sheet. Your Queen picture and information are due no later than June 6th so that you will appear in the Cavalcade Program. You should write your own story, appropriate for printing in the program, complete the attached Information Sheet, include a picture and return this information to the Cavalcade. **All of this information is due June 6th.** Your picture should be billfold size (2X3). Please get this information in on time so your picture and story will be in the program.

Your Preliminary Horsemanship Pattern will be ran on Monday evening, July 12, starting at 7:00p.m. Any questions prior to your Horsemanship pattern should be addressed to the Queen Chairman Eusty Barbee. You will be given a second reining pattern during your interview, which will be used in the Sunday finals. The top 5 contestants will be announced as finalists during Saturday night's Grand Entry and will perform their Finals pattern at the Cavalcade Finals held **Sunday, July 18 at 11:00a.m.** All finalists and their Club Presidents must sign an agreement of obligation in the office, before the finals on Sunday.

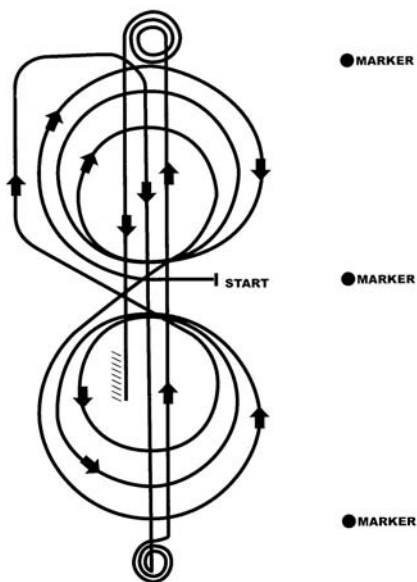
There are 4 Grand Entries; Wednesday, Thursday, Friday and Saturday evening performances starting at 7pm. No Grand Entry during the morning performances or on Sunday. You will act as pivots in each Grand Entry and must furnish and carry an American Flag in a flag boot. The flag must be 2ft X 3ft or 3ft X 5ft with the pole being 5ft in length. The parade will be held in downtown Pawhuska on Saturday, July 17, at 10:00 a.m. You are not required to carry a flag in the parade. You will be judged on all of these events.

All contestants should vote for "Miss Congeniality" at the office by Saturday. The votes will be counted Saturday night. Please familiarize yourself with the Queen rule, found in the Cavalcade rules that your club received. Copies of the rules will be available on our website or in the office the week of the Cavalcade. The Cavalcade office will be open at 1:00p.m. on Sunday, July 11.

WORKING COW HORSE PATTERN III



Mandatory Marker Along Fence or Wall Ride Pattern as Follows:

Trot to center of arena and stop. Start pattern facing toward judge.

1. Begin on right lead and complete three circles to right, two large fast circles followed by one small slow circle, change to left lead.
2. Complete three circles to left, two large, fast circles followed by one small slow circle. Change to right lead.
3. Continue loping around end of arena without breaking gait.
4. Run up center of arena to far end past the end marker and come to a sliding stop.
5. Complete 2 1/2 spins to the right.
6. Run up center of arena past the end marker, come to a sliding stop.
7. Complete 2 1/2 spins to the left.
8. Run back to middle of the arena past the center marker and come to a sliding stop.
9. Back at least 10 feet in a straight line.
10. Hesitate to complete pattern.

RULES & POLICIES GOVERNING

64th ANNUAL INTERNATIONAL ROUNDUP CLUBS' CAVALCADE July 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17, & 18, 2010

Adopted March 28, 2010

The Cavalcade Board of Directors will set the policies listed below. The Cavalcade Board reserves the right to ban ANY CLUB and its' Members who display unsportsmanlike conduct.

STRICTLY AMATEUR: The Cavalcade will be held as a strictly amateur rodeo and any Club entering a PRCA, IPRA, WPRA or PBR competing member as a contestant will be fined \$100.00 and must forfeit any winnings of such member. *AS OF 2005 - UNDER THE NEW United States Team Roping Championships (USTRC) guidelines, an individual number of 8 or above cannot compete in the Team Roping event.* These are the only organizations recognized as professional by the Cavalcade. Contestant must wear designated number at the discretion of Arena Director.

DRESS CODE: Night performances only. Shirts with a collar, pants (no shorts) & western footwear. either cowboy hat (no caps) or no hat at all. Violations of the dress code upon entering the arena will result in disqualification and a \$100 fine assessed to the contestants' Club, ALL prizes and checks won by ANY and ALL Club Members will be held until fine is paid.

CONDUCT: Any Club Member displaying unsportsmanlike conduct in the Arena, the Office, the camp grounds, toward other Club Members or Cavalcade Staff may result in a \$100 fine assessed to their Club and/or the forfeiting of any awards or money won by contestant. The Cavalcade may have the contestant removed and/or may ban contestant OR entire Club from participating in future Cavalcades.

MISTREATMENT OF ANIMAL: Any contestant abuses an animal by any unnecessary non-competitive or competitive action will constitute a disqualification and may constitute a disqualification of the club and forfeiture of all monies won. Judges will immediately inform the announcer that the contestant has been disqualified. Spectators will be informed of the disqualification due to unnecessary roughness against livestock. **Abuse of livestock will not be tolerated.**

AGE GROUPING: Junior: 12 & Under; Intermediate: 13-18; Senior: 19 & Over; Jr/Int: 18 & Under (Team Roping Only); Open Division: any age. Contestants must compete in his/her own age group and CANNOT move up or down. Contestant will enter & compete in the age group based on the age they will be on the first day of the Cavalcade & produce Birth Certificate if asked. Protests must be filed in writing at the office prior to the completion of the last event of the last show. All money due the contestant filed upon will be held until a written report is returned to the Club filing the protest. All contestants must have been a member of his/her club for at least 40 days prior to the first show of the Cavalcade, no later than June 5, 2008.

ENTRY FEES: No entry fees refunded unless event is canceled by the Cavalcade. All livestock events include a stock charge. Entry fees will be determined by the Cavalcade board of directors.

BOGUS CHECKS: A \$50 returned check fee will be charged in addition to the face amount of the check for any returned check. Returned checks left unclaimed or unsettled for 10 working days will be turned over the District Attorney's office for collection and prosecution. Entries by a Club that include **Individual's** with outstanding charges will not be accepted until those charges have been settled. Member's of a **Club** with outstanding charges will not be permitted to participate until the **Club's** charges are settled.

COGGINS TEST REQUIRED: All horses and equine related animals entering the grounds MUST be accompanied by a negative Coggins Test conducted within the previous 12 months. Photo copies are not acceptable. Animals must be marked by Cavalcade representative. Animals without a negative test will not be allowed to enter and any animal discovered on the grounds without a negative test will be evicted immediately. No Exotic animals allowed on grounds.

2010 Cavalcade Rules Cont'd

PERFORMANCE TIMES: Performances are Monday & Tuesday at 9:00am, Wednesday, Thursday, Friday at 9:00am and 7:00pm, Saturday at 9:00am sharp and 11:00 a.m. for Sunday Finals. There will be no Grand Entry in morning performances OR for Sunday Finals. There will be Grand Entries at each evening Performance.

FACILITIES: Campsites will be designated by Cavalcade. Office charge is \$100.00. Porta Johns are \$70.00 each and every Club must have their own Porta John: 1 up to 30 people and 2 over 30 people. electricity for campers with air conditioners is \$75.00. Each Club is responsible for helping keep the arena clear. Dogs must be kept under control. No bathing in stock tanks. No motorcycles, ATV's or golf carts allowed on the grounds, (except Cavalcade Staff).

BEST ALL-AROUND CLUB: The 3 best all-around clubs will be chosen from combined points from 5 categories: 1-Clubs will most contestants entered. 2-Clubs will greatest attendance (badges determines number). 3-Clubs with most contestants going to finals. 4-Best appearance in downtown parade. (See Parade). 5-Campgrounds and conduct of campers. Points are awarded as follows: 1st-10pts; 2nd 7pts; 3rd-4pts with a total of 50 points possible. In the event of a tie, the points for the number involved in the tie will be added up and divided equally. The best All-Around Club will receive an International Roundup Clubs Cavalcade Banner will joint pole, tassel, cord and headpiece. The winning Club will lead next year's parade. Clubs should display banners won in the past.

CLUB RIDING IN: Club riding the greatest distance to the Cavalcade will receive a trophy. Club must have 5 or more riders the entire distance. Club must designate one member to turn in mileage & complete form in office upon arrival. Once mileage is turned in, it cannot be changed.

CLUB TRAVELING FARTHEST: Club traveling farthest will receive a trophy. Must be 5 or more members to be classified as a Club. Club must designate one member to turn in mileage & complete form in office upon arrival. Once mileage is turned in, it cannot be changed.

DOWNTOWN PARADE: The Downtown Parade will be held on Saturday at 2:00 p.m. Points & Trophies will be awarded to the top 3 winners.

MONIES & FINALS: Top 10 fastest times/score will go to the Finals. *Except:* Chuck Wagon Race-4 wagons; Pony Express Race-6 teams; Wild Horse Race-4 teams. *GO MONEY:* There is only 1 Go round: the combination of Wednesday, Thursday, Friday & Saturday's performances. Monies will be paid to the top 6 places in each GO. *Except:* top 4 Chuck Wagons. *AVERAGE MONEY:* Average is the GO plus finals time/score. Average monies paid to the top 4 contestants in each event. If only 1 contestant has a combined time or score in finals, it is winner take all. The 4 fastest times in the GO will be paid as average money ONLY if no contestant places in the finals. Checks will be mailed no later than the 14th day following the Cavalcade to the name & address listed on the Club's entry form.

SUBSTITUTIONS: Substitutions must be a member of the same club & must be signed by a Club Officer listed on Roster. Substitutions must be made in the office no later than 1 hour prior to the performance they are in. One substitution per event per club & no substitutions on Sunday. Contestants must be present before each event starts. If name is called three times and has not entered arena, contestant will be disqualified.

GRAND ENTRY: No Grand Entries during the morning performances or for the Sunday Finals. Evening Grand Entries will begin at 7:00 p.m. sharp. Queens are required to ride in the four evening Grand Entries and act as pivots. They must furnish and carry an American Flag 2'X3' or 3' X 5' with a 5' pole in a flag boot.

HELPERS: The Chuck Wagon Race and Pony Express Race are the only helper events. Helpers are not eligible to win prizes or money. Helpers can be from any club that the contestant chooses. No outside help after contestant enters arena, or approaches starting line. Arena Director will watch for this.

GRIEVANCES: A Grievance Committee will be comprised of three members of various Clubs. Grievance must be signed by any officer listed on Club roster and filed at the office only. Grievances must be filed before the next performance begins. Grievances on Sunday must be filed immediately after that particular event. ***ALL JUDGES DECISIONS ARE FINAL & not subject to Grievances.*** Committee must consult all parties involved before making a decision. Committee's decision is final. Committee will attend all performances. Members of Grievance Committee will meet in the event a grievance is filed. Only authorized persons are allowed at the meeting. If a grievance is filed on the Saturday night show, a meeting will be called for Sunday morning with the results available no later than 10:00 a.m. If you feel a mistake has been made, you should seek this committee for a ruling. Persons who would like to serve on this Committee should notify the Chairman or the Secretary. Each member receives an arm band.

RULES

1. **SR MENS CALF ROPING** (Men, 19 & Up) One loop, if contestant misses, no time will be given. Contestant must daylight calf. One minute time limit to complete run. If there are too many entrants, eliminations will be conducted prior to performance. Contestants should exit through SW gate.
2. **SR WOMENS CALF ROPING:** (Women, 19 & Up) **BREAKAWAY** - One loop, if contestant misses, no time will be given. One minute time limit to rope calf. *Head must pass through the loop, catch as catch can.* Rope must breakaway at horn by calf. A Cavalcade line judge will tie on string and all contestants must use string provided at the chute. Ground money will be paid if no one catches. Handkerchief must be attached to rope at saddle horn.
3. **CALF ROPING:** (Jr Girls, 12 & Under) Same rules as Sr Women.
4. **CALF ROPING:** (Int Girls, 13 thru 18) Same rules as Sr Women.
5. **CALF ROPING:** (Jr Boys, 12 & Under) Same rules as Sr Women.
6. **CALF ROPING:** (Int Boys, 13 thru 18) Same rules as Sr Men.
7. **BULL RIDING:** (Open Division) See PRCA Rules. Only contestant and helper may be in chute area.
8. **WILD COW MILKING:** (Sr Men & Women) This is a dally roping. One loop, head must pass through loop and pull up in front of shoulders. Team is disqualified if cow is jerked down or if roper drags cow, (Judge decides). Teams will be disqualified if hands are not kept away from cow's eyes. Team cannot chase cow once they lose possession after roping cow. Rope must be free of any part of horse or rigging before cow is milked. Cow must be on her feet when milked. Roper must milk cow and bring back milk either on foot or horseback. Rope must be off cow before milker crosses flag line. Milker will hand bottle to Judge upon return to finish line. There must be milk in bottle when returned. **MUGGER AND ROPER MUST BE OF SAME CLUB.** Substitutions of mugger or roper must be made in same manner as all other substitutions, or team is disqualified. The cows used for this event will be of the same breed; either have horns or no horns.
9. **CHUCK WAGON RACE:** (Open Event) Event will be ran on race track. 4 Wagons will go to Finals. A Cavalcade representative will start race. Starting line will be on north end of track on straightaway. Race begins from rolling start with option of dead start. Positions are drawn by Secretary and entries will run in order on program. Race will consist of one team of horses or mules, wagon, driver, shotgun rider and two outriders. The Outriders will be horseback. The Chuck Wagon may be any size. Chuck box not required.

Rule #9 - Chuck Wagon Race - Continued from previous page.....

Wheels may be iron or wooden spoke, may have hard rubber, balloon or air tires. No restrictions on wagon tongues. Wagon must be equipped with bows, tarp with club name on tarp. Riders and driver must wear matching colors assigned by Secretary. Outriders horses, team and wagon must be used in downtown parade, and horses must be numbered like pony express horses. Complete team (wagon and outriders) must cross designated line, driver and shotgun rider must stop team unhook tugs from double tree then circle lead team in a 360 circle. Rehitch properly (at no time may any part of team cross finish line until hitching is complete) get back into wagon and proceed across finish line. The first outrider must cross first designated line at north end of grandstand, dismount behind or alongside his chuck wagon, unsaddle his horse, lead horse in a 360 circle, re-saddle (horses cannot be tied to wagon to be re-saddled), ride horse across finish line. Second outrider must cross first designated line, stop behind or alongside his wagon and build fire on the ground. Outrider can help outrider but CANNOT help re-hitch team. The Driver and/or Shotgun rider can't get out of the wagon until the whole wagon crosses the line. If outriders block the way of other team or get ahead of his own wagon, he will be disqualified. No horns, bells, etc., may be used, only buggy whip & voice commands. Judges have authority to disqualify teams for rule infractions or poor sportsmanship. One judge for each team will be at first designated line to judge the unhitching, rehitching, building fire, unsaddling and resaddling, and one judge for each team will be on the finish line at South end of Grandstands. Judges will draw line on track to designate 1st and 2nd lines. Grievance committee must inspect substitutions on horses and make ruling.

10. PONY EXPRESS RACE: (Open Division) Only THREE teams will run each race. The SIX teams with the fastest times will compete in the finals. Inside rail is always No. 1 position. Each rider will hold the same position at each remount station throughout race. Horses or mules must be owned by RUC members. All members of team must be of same club. Race will be around 3/4 mile oval track and started as an unmounted race. Race is started with each contestant on the ground and his back to starter; when whistle blows, rider mounts horse and leaves. NOTE: Starter will start race, not Announcer. Contestant must have three saddled mounts, a stock saddle must be used with no weight requirement. Any type bit is allowed. Rider may use any method of mounting, but must mount without any assistance. Horses are to be held by hand only. Horses must be staggered at remount stations. Rider will race 1/4 mile, get off and touch ground, mount next horse, ride 1/4 mile, change mounts in same manner, ride to finish line. No horse can stop less than 100 feet past finish line. The 100 foot line will be marked and horses must go past that line. Contestant must have two assistants at remount stations and horse must be turned over to assistant. Contestant permitting horse to get loose on track will be disqualified. Club members must ride the Pony Express horses in downtown parade. Two representatives from two clubs will be appointed to inspect and mark horses so they can be identified in parade. If horses are not marked and ridden in parade, contestant will be disqualified. Make effort through office to have horses marked. This must be done PRIOR to running event. Grievance committee must inspect substitutions on horses and make ruling.

11. POLE BENDING: (Sr Men & Women, 19 & Up) AQHA pattern will be used. 5 second penalty for each pole knocked over. Contestant may set pole up but cannot dismount. Enter through center alley, exit SW gate.

12. POLE BENDING: (Int Boys & Girls, 13 thru 18) Same rules as Sr Division.

13. POLE BENDING: (Jr Boys & Girls, 12 & Under) Same rules as Sr Division.

14. FLAG RACE: (Jr Boys, 12 & Under) Starting line will be at least 60 feet north in the arena. A barrel will be placed 125 feet from starting line. A bucket of sand with a flag in it will be placed on barrel. Rider will start race mounted in the arena, race to the flag, rider must circle the barrel either to right or left, pick up flag from barrel and carry flag back to starting line. Contestant will be disqualified if flag is dropped. It will be a qualified ride as long as the flag or portion of the flag is brought back. Contestant will be disqualified if any part of the flag or stick is used to whip horse. Five second penalty for knocking over barrel. Enter through center alley,

exit SW gate.

15. FLAG RACE: (Jr Girls, 12 & Under) Same rules as Jr Boys.

16. BAREBACK BRONC RIDING: (Open Division) Stock will be drawn each day. One hand rigging is to be used. Riders may use their own rigging if not over 10 inches in width at hand hold and over six-inch "D" ring, or not a freak. Judges will decide on riggings. Riders who are knocked off chute or when horse falls out of chute will be entitled to a re-ride at the discretion of the judges. Rider will be given a re-ride if flank comes off or breaks, provided rider completes qualified ride. Re-rides will be decided by judges. Rider is disqualified if rigging comes off horse or breaks. To qualify, rider must have spurs over the break of shoulders and touching horse when horse's feet hit the ground first jump out of the chute. Horse must be ridden eight (8) seconds, time starts when horse leaves chute. Contestants have the right to call on judges to decide if horse is properly flanked and cinched. Any of the following will disqualify rider: rowels too sharp (in judges opinion); no locked rowels; being bucked off; touching animal with free hand; Only contestant and helper in the chute area.

17. WILD HORSE RACE: (Open Division) 4 best times will compete in finals. Secretary will draw for order on program. Horses will be shoot ran. The first team listed on the program will get the first horse loaded until all horses are taken. Contestants must furnish halter and lead rope which must meet approval of stock contractor. Lead ropes cannot be longer than 10 feet. Team must be at chute when called for. All horses will be turned out at same time. If horse does not come out of the chute, team will get a re-ride. Team cannot mug horse until horse's entire body clears the chute. Lead ropes cannot be dallied or fastened in any way to chute or gate. Rider may have two helpers to help in any way he chooses. Horse must be saddled after horse is let out of chute. When rider mounts, helpers must let go of horse. Lead rope cannot be dallied around saddle horn. Rider must cross designated finish line to receive time. Team is disqualified if horse gets loose or if rider is bucked off. There is a 5 minute time limit to mount horse.

18. BARREL RACE: (Sr Women, 19 & Over) Barrels set in triangle. Starting line will be at least 60 feet north in the arena. The first two barrels will be 33 feet from starting line and 90 feet apart. The third barrel will be 100 feet from the center between the first two barrels. Rider can turn either right or left. If a right turn is made on the first barrel then two left turns must be made on the remaining barrels. If a left turn is made on the first barrel then two right turns must be made on the remaining barrels. Rider must circle each barrel and will be disqualified if proper turns are not made. 5 second penalty for each barrel knocked over. Rider may set up barrel but cannot dismount. Barrels will be staked with ropes. Enter through center alley, exit SW gate.

19. BARREL RACE: (Sr Men, 19 & Over) Same rules and Sr Women.

20. BARREL RACE: (Int Boys & Girls, 13 thru 18) Same rules as Sr Women.

21. BARREL RACE: (Jr Boys & Girls, 12 & Under) Same rules as Sr Women except the distance between barrels will be: The first two barrels will be 33 feet from the starting line and 60 feet apart. The third barrel will be 90 feet from the center between the first two barrels.

22. DALLY TEAM ROPING: (Sr Men & Women, 19 & Over) Under the new USTRC guidelines, an individual number of 7 or lower can rope. One team per Club. 2 loops ONLY. Five second penalty for catching 1 heel. Legal catches: horns, half head and neck. No figure eighths. Contestants must hold dally until inspected by Judge. Ropers 60 years of age or older AND women of any age may tie on solid for the heeling end ONLY.

23. DALLY TEAM ROPING: (Jr-Int Boys & Girls, 18 & Under-this event only) One team per club. 2 loops only. Five second penalty for catching 1 heel. Legal catches: horns, half head and neck. No figure eighths. Contestants must hold dally until inspected by Judge. Women any age may tie on solid for heeling end ONLY.

24. QUEEN CONTEST: The Queen contest is a policy set by the Cavalcade Board of Directors.

(Int & Sr Women) Queens must be a member of the Club they represent. Contestant may enter other events but must compete for own club. Queens will be judged at all functions as follows: Personality & Presentation 30%; Appearance 20%; Horsemanship 50%. Queen must ride the same horse during all queen events. Queens are required to complete a horsemanship pattern, participate in the four night grand entries, downtown parade and Queen's reception. In Grand Entries, Queens act as pivots and must furnish and carry an American Flag, 2' X 3' or 3' X 5' with a 5' pole in a flag boot. Queens are not required to carry a flag in the downtown parade. Judge(s) will be disinterested person(s). Queens will be interviewed by Judge(s) at Reception and given a second reigning pattern to be used for Sunday's Finals. All queens will ride in Saturday Night's Grand Entry at which time the top 5 finalists will be announced. The queen will be determined off of accumulated scoring. All finalists & their Club President must sign an agreement as to her obligations if she is chosen Queen. Trophies presented to the 2nd & 3rd place contestants. The winner will be announced during the Sunday Finals and will not be required to perform further. If a horse gets sick or crippled, Queen should report to the Grievance Committee who will inspect horse and decide if horse can be substituted. The reigning Queen may participate in any event other than the Queen Contest which she cannot enter again. All questions or problems should be addressed to the Secretary in the office.
